





I have already sung your praises to everyone I know. Bless you!



A Space for Healing and Remembrance


The wind phone is a simple yet profoundly meaningful concept—a disconnected phone placed in a peaceful outdoor setting where individuals can "call" and speak to loved ones who have passed away.

The idea originated in Japan in 2010 when Itaru Sasaki, grieving the loss of his beloved cousin, set up an old phone booth in his garden. He found solace in picking up the receiver and speaking his heart into the wind, believing his words might somehow reach his lost loved one.

A wind phone is not about receiving answers, but about creating space for presence. It offers a quiet moment to connect with memory, hold space for grief, and send love into the wind. This deeply personal act mirrors the very spirit of The Denver Hospice—where we support families in finding peace and healing.

That is why, when Eagle Scout Michael Fries approached us with a heartfelt offer to build a wind phone for our hospice, we were deeply moved. Michael, inspired by his own connection to hospice care, poured his creativity and generosity into this project. He crafted a beautiful space for families to reflect, remember, and communicate with their lost loved ones.

This thoughtful addition will provide comfort and healing for years to come.
